A: I prefer to dissolve the pungency of the onion and highlight the sweet and savory notes. Onions go in almost every sauce I make especially my tomato sauce. Paulie was wrong in the movie Goodfellas—you can never add too many onions to tomato sauce. The scenario where I do highlight the pungency is on a delicious burger, in this case I love a sweet or red onion.

U.S. No. 2 stocks are tight; new crop potatoes exhibit very few quality defects during the early stages of harvesting. Expect better quality once stocks have gone through the sweat process and are in storage.
