

HIGHLIGHTS

Lettuces

Desert region morning temperatures have dipped into the mid-30°s to low 40°s. If cold weather persists, light carton and bin weights for commodity and value-added lettuces will persist for several more weeks.

Cabbage

Supplies are slightly lower as growing regions have moved south and towards the desert, away from coastal California. Lower yields per acre have significantly reduced availability for processors, driving the general market higher.

Brussels Sprouts

Expect active markets through late December; prices will ease as holiday demand subsides and Mexican volume ramps up.



SEEDLESS LEMONS

- Seedless lemons are now available in the California desert region; all sizes are available.
- Both fancy and choice grades are available with prices matching that of conventional lemon packs.

MELONS

- Cantaloupe and honeydew supplies are tight.
- The desert season has ended and offshore fruit has begun shipping. Prices are high, but will ease as stocks increase.

STRAWBERRIES

- California volume remains low due to recent rain, but Mexican supplies are increasing.
- The Florida season will start in early December; Markon First Crop® (MFC) Strawberries will ship from that region by mid-December.

Supplies will remain extremely tight through January when growers move into fields replanted after the hurricanes. Round tomatoes are limited in mainland Mexico: Roma volume is slightly higher. Baja stocks won't reach sufficient levels until late December/early January due to damage caused by Hurricane Kay. The Culiacan season has been delayed until mid-January. Quality varies significantly. MFC Tomatoes are sporadic; packer label will be shipped as necessary.

Olive oil

Parmesan cheese, grated Golden beets, peeled and chopped

Salt and pepper to taste

Toss fennel and beets in olive oil. Bake at 400 degrees F until tender (approximately 30 minutes); cool.

Heat a skillet or griddle until very hot. Sprinkle grated Parmesan in small rounds and allow to melt, then brown. Carefully scrape the cheese off, break into bite-size pieces, and reserve.
