RAIN EVENTS

Markon inspectors are actively monitoring field conditions after several storms affected the Arizona/California desert region. Quality/shelf-life challenges are developing throughout the industry after the most recent rain event and previous ice events. Lettuce and tender leaf items in particular will be most impacted.

RSS CILANTRO

Markets are expected to remain relatively steady but industrywide quality challenges will persist as additional precipitation is in the forecast.

ONIONS

February and into March. White onion supplies remain scarce; markets are extreme in all regions.



TOMATOES

- Roma and round tomato volume is increasing in Mexico;

Anaheims, Jalapeno, Pasilla, and Serrano prices are level; industry supplies are average. Quality is very good. MFC Chile Peppers are available.

The market is stable; stocks are plentiful. Production is in full swing in Oxnard and Santa Maria, California, as well as the Arizona-California desert region. Quality is very good; disease pressure is minimal. MFC Celery is available.

Winter Barley Salad

This hearty grain salad gets umami from mushrooms, sweetness from months or chilled when it starts to heat up.

1/4 C olive oil (split)

1 C Markon First Crop Mushrooms, chopped

2 C wild mushrooms

1/4 C Ready-Set-Serve Peeled Garlic, chopped

1 T Ready-Set-Serve Lemon Juice

1 C Kabocha squash, chopped and roasted

3 C pearled barley, cooked

1 oz. pumpkin sprouts

1 tsp. kosher salt

1/4 tsp. black pepper

4 oz. Manchego cheese, grated

Heat half of the oil in a large skillet. Sauté white mushrooms until browned; reserve. Heat remaining oil and sauté wild mushrooms and garlic until browned; deglaze with lemon juice.

In a large mixing bowl, combine both mushroom mixtures, roasted Kabocha, barley, pumpkin sprouts, salt, pepper, and cheese. Toss to combine and serve warm or cold.
