HIGHLIGHTS

STRAWBERRIES

Warm, sunny weather should aid growth this week, increasing yields and deepening color. Prices will start inching down from recent elevated levels.

LETTUCES

Green leaf, iceberg, and romaine markets are expected to climb this week the first rain event of the spring season occurred this past weekend.

CAULIFLOWER

Prices are expected to remain low this week but are forecast to rise by the middle of next week. Recent rain is aiding growth.



LIMES

- Markets are trending downward and will remain low through spring.
- Supplies are dominated by small sizes (175- to 250-count fruit).

BROCCOLI

- Overall supplies are abundant; prices are trending down.
- Domestic quality is good; next week's rain followed by warm weather may lead to increased occurrences of pin rot/brown bead, yellowing, and mildew pressure.

MELONS

- Honeydew supplies remain tight; markets are climbing.
- Cantaloupe volume is average; prices are steady.

Quality is good: shriveling and pitting are occasional problems. The California desert season will begin later next week, further increasing availability. Canadian greenhouse red pepper yields are increasing. MFC and ESS Green and Red Bell Peppers are on the market.

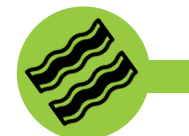
Earth Day is a great time to celebrate sustainability on menus. How do you suggest operators do so?

MENU FEATURE

Every chef needs a few solid recipes in his or her repertoire. That's why Markon has put together a catalog of fresh produce-based recipes that cover it all: day- and menu-parts, the range of seasons, a variety of cuisines, and a diverse list of ingredients.

Lemony Dijon Potato-Shallot Salad

Skip the heavy mayo and opt for a light, citrus-y salad made with tender potatoes and zesty shallots.

- 2 Tbsp. white wine vinegar
- 3 Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil
- 1 Tbsp. Dijon mustard
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. kosher salt
- 1/4 tsp. black pepper
- 1 tsp. zest of Markon First Crop Lemons
- 2 lbs. tiny potatoes, boiled until tender
- 1 C Ready-Set-Serve Peeled Shallots, cut into thin rings
- 1/4 C Ready-Set-Serve Italian Parsley, chopped

Whisk together the first seven ingredients. Toss warm potatoes, shallots, and parsley in this vinaigrette. Serve warm or chilled.
