HIGHLIGHTS

LIMITED TENDER LEAF ITEMS

Expect tight supplies and elevated industry markets for the next two weeks. Prior rains and recent heat spikes have depleted yields. RSS Arugula, Spinach, and Spring Mix are limited; packer label will be substituted as needed.

TOMATOES

Prices are climbing. Florida tomato crops are being severely affected by the recent freezing temperatures.

SQUASH

Markets are rising. Supplies will remain limited due to Florida's low temperatures. Demand has shifted to Mexico, driving up those markets as well.



GRAPES

- The market is starting to inch down a bit/ Chilean MFC and ESS Green and Red Seedless Grapes as well as packer label portioned grapes are on the market.
- Offshore MFC Lunch Bunch Grapes will become available in a week or two.

LIMES

- Prices remain elevated and are expected to stay firm as ongoing quality issues in Mexico limit availability.
- Stylar-end breakdown, oil spotting, and skin condition issues are increasing significantly following recent rain events.

BELL PEPPERS

- Expect rising markets for approximately two weeks.
- Florida's cold weather has impacted bell pepper production.

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apples

Although markets for Gala and Honeycrisp are slightly higher, prices for other varieties are level. Quality is excellent; sugar levels range from 15 to 18 Brix. MFC Gala, Golden Delicious, Granny Smith, Fuji, and Red Delicious Apples are available.

asparagus

Prices are steady to slightly higher. Production will increase in Caborca, Mexico over the next several weeks; growers are also shipping from the Mexicali area. New crop quality is very good; firm spears and tight tips are being reported. MFC Asparagus is available.



avocados

Industry prices are up due to strong Super Bowl demand. RSS Avocado products offer steady prices, allowing operators to offer guacamole that doesn't break the budget. RSS Chunks, Halves, Pico de Gallo Guacamole, Authentic Chunky Guacamole, and Pure Pulp are available.

MFC Broccoli Crowns are sporadic; Markon Best Available (MBA) will be shipped when quality doesn't meet specifications.

The market should remain stable for the next week before firming slightly during the upcoming harvesting transition period. Overall production from Guatemala and Honduras is below typical levels. Size is dominated by 9- and 12-count fruit, as well as jumbo sizes. Quality is very good; expect strong color and sweet flavor. Sugar levels range from 12–14% Brix.

The market is up; inconsistent size, discoloration, and insect damage are minimizing yields in the Arizona-California desert region. Above-average temperatures and dry conditions are forecast for the coming week with a slight cooling trend expected by the weekend. Higher temperatures will aid growth, but may also cause inconsistent size. ESS Cauliflower is sporadic; packer label will be substituted if stocks don't meet specifications.

Prices are inching up. The Arizona-California desert harvesting schedule is two weeks ahead due to warm weather. Fringe burn, mildew, seeder, and insect pressure are occasional problems. Florida's freezing temperatures are tightening East Coast stocks. MFC Green Leaf Lettuce is available.



honeydew

Markets are up slightly as growers enter a harvesting transition period. Overall supply levels from Guatemala and Honduras are lower than in past years. Size is dominated by five-, five/jumbo-, and six-count fruit. Eight-count fruit is limited. Quality is excellent: growers report minimal external defects. Sugar levels range from 11 to 13 Brix.



iceberg

Prices are extremely elevated as Arizona-California desert production dips. Low temperatures are reducing yields in Florida. MFC Iceberg Lettuce is available, but MBA will be substituted if weights are low.



lemons

The market is unchanged. California supplies are plentiful, especially large sizes. Quality is excellent. MFC and ESS Lemons are available.

Cauliflower is a dependable cold-weather ingredient. How do you use this vegetable on winter menus?

A

Cauliflower is a winter workhorse—it's neutral enough to take on bold flavors but still has this cozy, roasted sweetness when you treat it right. In winter, I love turning it into a smoked cauliflower bisque with brown butter and chili crunch.

It eats like comfort food but still feels modern. It also crushes on share plates—try tandoori-spiced roasted cauliflower with a cooling yogurt drizzle, or crisp it hard in the fryer and toss it in a maple-gochujang glaze for a winter riff on wings. Even simple things like a charred cauliflower mash can replace potatoes and instantly elevate a plate. Winter menus need warmth and depth, and cauliflower delivers every time.



TIPS FOR SERVING RSS CAULIFLOWER FLORETS



- 1.** Toss RSS Cauliflower Florets with olive oil, salt, pepper, and grated Parmesan cheese; roast and serve aside steaks and chops.
- 2.** Steam black mussels, RSS Cauliflower Florets, saffron, and fish stock until shellfish open; garnish with snipped MFC Chives.
- 3.** Top cheesy polenta with chopped and sautéed RSS Cauliflower Florets, RSS Peeled Garlic, and chopped spicy Italian sausage.

Buffalo Cauliflower

These game-day favorites are spicy, vegetarian, and delicious! Add them to your appetizer roster, either deep fried or baked for the wellness crowd.

1C	Flour
1C	Cornstarch
2 1/2 C	Buttermilk
4 cloves	RSS Peeled Garlic, minced
1T	Cayenne
2 tsp.	Paprika
2 tsp.	Salt
2 lb.	RSS Cauliflower Florets
1C	Panko breadcrumbs
1/2 C	Parmesan cheese, grated
1C	Buffalo sauce

Preheat oven to 425°F/218°C.

Mix together flour, cornstarch, buttermilk, garlic, cayenne, paprika, and salt. Whisk and add florets. Toss to coat evenly. Add panko and Parmesan cheese; toss again, making sure all florets are coated. Bake for 15 minutes; flip and cook 15 minutes longer (alternately cook in deep fryer). When cooked, toss all in buffalo sauce and place back in oven for 15 more minutes.

Serve with herby green ranch dressing on the side.
