HIGHLIGHTS

ASPARAGUS

Supplies remain extremely limited as production in both Mexico and Peru continues to fall short of demand. Sizing continues to skew heavily towards smaller spears; jumbo and extra-large sizes are especially tight. Expect significantly higher pricing, limited substitutions, and ongoing size restrictions into early 2027.

BELL PEPPERS

Expect steady green bell markets over the next week, followed by upward pressure heading into October. Red bell prices will remain steady to slightly higher over the next two weeks.

HURRICANE POLO

Mexican avocados and limes are the primary items that Markon is monitoring; chiles, cucumbers, squash, and tomatoes could see potential impacts later in the week, depending on how much rain falls from Hurricane Polo.



PEARS

- The California pear season is expected to end by mid-October.
- New crop Washington Bartlett supplies are available.

GREEN LEAF, ICEBEG, & ROMAINE

- The iceberg market continues to escalate.
- Green leaf and romaine prices are inching up as well.

STRAWBERRIES

- Prices have declined due to weak demand, creating a softer market with plentiful availability.
- California growers are shifting from the Salinas/Watsonville region, where quality ranges from fair to average, to Oxnard for the fall season.

New crop Fuji, Gala, Golden Delicious, Granny Smith, Honeycrisp, and Red Delicious apples are shipping out of the Pacific Northwest; yields will increase through the month. Quality is very good; sugar levels range from 15 to 18% Brix.

Supplies remain extremely limited as production in both Mexico and Peru continues to fall short of demand. Sizing continues to skew heavily towards smaller spears; jumbo and extra-large sizes are especially tight. Expect significantly higher pricing, limited substitutions, and ongoing size restrictions into early 2027. MFC Asparagus is limited; packer label is being shipped as necessary.

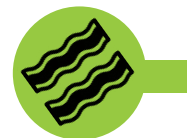
Fall and winter salads incorporate more grains and hearty vegetables. What are your favorite flavor combinations for this time of year?

Israeli Couscous-Stuffed Bell Peppers

Whether served hot or cold, this hearty vegan dish makes a great lunch entrée or dinner side.

1/4 C	Olive oil
4	MFC Green Bell Peppers, halved
3 C	Israeli couscous, cooked
1 C	Wild rice, cooked
1 C	MFC Mushrooms, sautéed and chopped
2 T	MFC Italian Parsley, chopped
1/4 C	Cranberry raisins, chopped
1 tsp.	Kosher salt
1/4 tsp.	Black pepper
1/4 C	Balsamic vinaigrette

Preheat oven to 375°F. Rub oil over bell peppers; place on baking sheet face down. Roast until tender, for approximately 20 minutes.

In a large mixing bowl, combine couscous, wild rice, sautéed mushrooms, parsley, cranberry raisins, salt, pepper, and vinaigrette. Toss to combine. Fill each pepper half with couscous mixture and serve.

Top crunchy crostini rounds with smoked salmon, shaved cucumber, and finely minced red bell peppers; top with baby dill and remoulade sauce.
